ESG Champion In Sustainability & CSR

Every effort we make at IOI Corporation Berhad (IOIC) - whether it's advancing decarbonisation, circularity, biodiversity or empowering the community – our collective efforts drive nature positive impacts for our people, our planet and our future generation. Our climate initiatives led to a 42% reduction in Scope 1 and 2 greenhouse gas emissions in FY2024, surpassing our 2025 target a year ahead, through methane capture, carbon sequestration and circular waste management. Meanwhile, our IOI Foundation has invested over RM65.4 million since 1985 to support education, community welfare and socio-economic development.

Our initiatives were recognised on the national stage at the 10th Sustainability & CSR Malaysia Awards 2025, where we received the Company of the Year (Plantation) – ESG Champion Award on 17 July 2025. Presented by Deputy Minister of Women, Family & Community Development Datuk Seri Dr Noraini Ahmad, the award reaffirms our holistic philanthropic approach that goes far beyond the bottom line.

Held at the Berjaya Times Square Hotel, Kuala Lumpur, the ceremony honoured 65 exemplary Malaysian corporations for their contributions in building a more sustainable and compassionate nation. Running alongside the event was the CSR Malaysia Carnival, which brought together 22 NGOs and foundations to foster cross-sector partnerships for greater societal impact.


A Fruitful Bunch Of Wins

Empty fruit bunches (EFB) are usually considered as waste after the oil has been extracted from fresh fruit bunches in palm oil mills. But not at IOI Pukin Palm Oil Mill. We reuse EFB as mulch in our estates to improve soil health and reduce the need for chemical fertilisers. We also store the EFB properly to prevent any liquid runoff (leachate) and environmental contamination. To strengthen transparency, we maintain efficient record-keeping and documentation to ensure full traceability and accountability.

Furthermore, we strictly adhere to the Malaysia's Environmental Quality Act 1974 by submitting scheduled waste and environmental monitoring reports in a timely manner, and maintaining operational parameters within the approved discharge limits. Our effective, sustainable and compliant handling of EFB was recognised by the Department of Environment Pahang. As such, we received the Best Empty Fruit Bunch Management Award (Zone 2) and Best License Compliance Award (Zone 2) at the Seminar on Clean Water Ahead: Managing Pollution for a Sustainable Future and Majlis Penyerahan Lesen Premis Yang Ditetapkan (Kilang Kelapa Sawit), which was held at Geo Resort Hotel, Genting Highlands from 15 to 16 July 2025.

These wins stand as both a milestone and a motivator for the team to continue raising the bar for sustainability and contributing to a greener, more responsible palm oil industry.







Glittery Awards On Sustainability

As one of the world's most trusted sustainability platforms, EcoVadis evaluates more than 130,000 companies worldwide across four key themes of Environment, Labor & Human Rights, Ethics and Sustainable Procurement. The bar is rising higher each year, but so is IOI Oleochemical Industries Berhad (IOI Oleo). We continue to shine in our latest 2025 EcoVadis assessments with a gold and three silver EcoVadis medals.

IOI Oleo GmbH secured the fifth Gold Eco Vadis medal, placing it among the top 5% companies worldwide with scores between 73 and 80. In June 2025, IOI Acidchem Sdn Bhd, IOI Esterchem (M) Sdn Bhd and IOI Pan-Century Oleochemicals Sdn Bhd (PCOC) received the Silver EcoVadis medals, each ranking in the top 15% companies with scores of 66 to 72. Notably, IOI Acidchem is placed in the 92nd percentile, while IOI Esterchem and IOI PCOC both achieved the 87th percentile. These results position IOI Oleo as a global sustainability leader in the oleochemical industry, underscoring our consistent progress and commitment to reducing our carbon footprint and building a resilient supply chain.

IOI Properties Group Berhad (IOIPG) delivered a robust financial performance in FY2024 on the back of a diversified portfolio and resilient business model. Revenue grew 13% year-on-year, while profit after tax rose by 48% to RM2.07 billion in FY2024, from RM1.40 billion in FY2023. This milestone reflects our steady expansion across all three business segments -Property Development, Property Investment and Hospitality & Leisure – demonstrating our ability to sustain financial performance while creating long-term value for our stakeholders.



This strong performance earned IOIPG a prestigious recognition at *The Edge Billion Ringgit Club* (BRC) 2025 Awards, where we received the Highest Growth in Profit After Tax Over Three Years under the Property (RM3 Billion & Above Market Capitalisation) category. The accolade, which measures companies' profit growth over a rolling-three-year period, reaffirms the effectiveness of our strategies in delivering sustainable growth, enhancing diversification and building resilience







Penang's unique ecosystems and the importance of preserving them for generations to come.



CAS-cading Innovation In Every Drop

Palm oil mill effluent (POME) is a dark brown wastewater produced during palm oil milling that requires proper treatment before discharge due to its high pollutant load. Treated POME is usually decoloured to light brown but it is possible to treat POME to be decoloured and clear like the river water. By consistently maintaining biological oxygen demand (BOD) levels below 20 mg/L, the treated discharge becomes not only visibly clearer but also healthier for rivers and streams. This helps maintain sufficient oxygen levels to support fish and other aquatic life, protect biodiversity and prevent waterways from turning foul or lifeless.

> This breakthrough is made possible by the Continuous Adsorption System (CAS), a cutting-edge tertiary wastewater treatment technology developed by the Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB). Our Pamol Kluang Palm Oil Mill made history as the first in Malaysia to install and test the CAS commercially in a partnership with MPOB in 2023. In collaboration with MPOB, we are also exploring the recycling of treated water in mill boilers, potentially reducing our water footprint by up to 25%. This was followed by our growing fleet of integrated electric cart scissorlifts (ECS) at Pamol Timur Estate, excelling in in-field evacuation while driving cost savings and labour efficiency. The visit concluded at Pamol Barat Estate with the mini tractor scissorlift (MTS), designed for young and prime palms to enhance productivity through job specialisation and machine optimisation.

Driving Down GHG

The numbers speak for themselves – the greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions at IOI Edible Oils Sdn Bhd (IOIEO) are going down. Since our FY2015/16 base year, both our absolute GHG emissions and emission intensity (Scope 1 and 2) have fallen by a significant 64%, surpassing the Group's 40% reduction target for the same period. The most noticeable drop was from FY2019/20 onwards, reflecting the success of our energy-efficiency measures and carbon

Our achievement is the result of years of commitment in driving innovative, energy-saving and low-carbon initiatives. Key efforts during our FY2024/25 included the re-designing of our piping systems to reduce electricity use, lowering steam and power consumption at the Dry Fractionation Plant 2 by increasing throughput with new chilled water connections, and upgrading to energy-efficient cooling towers and air compressors. Our initiatives in waste valorisation, renewable biomass energy and automation have also made us more self-sustaining, responsible and

Powering A **Cleaner Tomorrow**

Phase 3 of IOI Acidchem Sdn Bhd's solar photovoltaic (PV) installation has been completed! This 1,329.12 kWp self-consumption solar system at Acidchem 3's warehouse is expected to generate about 2,000 MWh of clean electricity and cut around 1,500 tCO₂e of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions annually.

Phase 1, installed at our main office and cafeteria, has a capacity of 83 kWp, generating around 600 MWh of renewable energy and reducing about 400 tCO₂e of GHG emissions annually. Phase 2, located at the Acidchem's soap noodle plant and store area, has a capacity of 353 kWp, generating around 1,000 MWh and reducing about 800 tCO₂e of GHG

With all three phases now operational, our total solar capacity has reached around 1,800 kWp. We are now producing an estimated 3,600 MWh of green energy and reducing overall GHG emissions by approximately 2,800 tCO₂e annually. Our renewable energy journey keeps us moving towards a cleaner, greener future where every ray of sunlight helps power our operations, reduce our footprint and move us closer to a more sustainable





Takes On The Slope

Oil palm cultivation takes precision and persistence, especially when it is on steep slopes where we need to rely on manual labour simply because these areas are inaccessible to heavy machinery. With about 40% of Malaysia's oil palm plantation grown on terraced areas and labour shortages on the rise, IOI Plantation is co-developing a new tele-operated Autonomous Terrace Fertilizer Spreader (ATFS) with partners from universities, start-ups and industry experts to modernise agriculture through innovation and smart technology.

The ATFS is compact yet capable of covering two to three times more hectarage than manual labour. It is designed to navigate uneven and hilly terrain, spread fertiliser with more precision and able to capture real-time field data to improve efficiency and reduce wastage. Following a successful fabrication review on 11 August 2025, this project has passed the concept and feasibility study. Now in the system architecture and prototyping stage, the focus is on systems integration, before moving on to field testing, machine learning, and ultimately, pilot deployment.



With this project, we are not just automating a single agricultural process, but laying the foundation for a modular, intelligent agriculture ecosystem to benefit the entire industry.



Co-generating A Greener Future

Did you know that co-generation is actually one of the most energy-efficient technologies in Malaysia? Unlike traditional methods of generating electricity and heat separately, co-generation combines them in a single process using just one fuel source. IOI Acidchem Sdn Bhd is advancing this innovation with the commissioning of our second co-generation plant in July 2025, adding 3.2 MW of capacity to our renewable energy infrastructure.

This builds on the success of our first 6.5 MW co-generation plant commissioned in 2015, which was the first gas turbine co-generation system in the Malaysian oleochemicals industry. When both plants run at full capacity, we will significantly reduce our reliance on grid electricity while cutting an estimated 9,000 tonnes of CO₂ emissions annually.

Emerging and cutting-edge technologies such as AI, 5G, 6G, IoT, drones, cloud computing, green ICT and the latest applications are applied in real-world settings. IOI Corporation Berhad's senior management team, led by Group Managing Director & Chief Executive Dato' Lee Yeow Chor, observed how these smart systems are driving productivity and efficiency in the Huawei Innovation Centres in Shenzhen and Dongguan, China.






Mostly "B"


Any starting point is a good point as long as you make a move. Develop a roadmap outlining your actions, timeline and required resources towards your goals/objectives.


